

## Regular

May 19, 2021

Ontario City Council met in regular session on May 19, 2021, in the Municipal Building, with Council President Eddie Gallo presiding. The meeting opened at 7:08 p.m., with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present during roll call were Council members Dave Rehfeldt, Ken Earhart, Josh Bradley, Michele Webb, Nathan Sunderland, Council President Eddie Gallo, Mayor Randy Hutchinson, Law Director Andrew Medwid, Service-Safety Director Jeff Wilson, and Clerk of Council Cathy VanAuker.

The minutes of the regular Council meeting of May 5, 2021 were presented for approval. Hearing no corrections, the minutes were approved as presented.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Mr. Rehfeldt reported the Finance Committee met this evening to discuss details for the infrastructure and park improvement plans. The Committee approved a motion to present legislation to Council for a \$2.4 million loan for these projects. \$400,000 was added to the original plan for ballfield lights. The loan will be ten years at a low interest rate, not yet determined. The Economic Development, Parks, and Finance Committees worked together to develop this plan. Also, during the meeting, budget revisions were reviewed for the \$1.1 million expected from the Federal Government.

Mr. Bradley scheduled a Parks Committee meeting on June 2, 2021, 5:30 p.m., at the Marshall Park playscape pavilion.

**MAYOR'S REPORT**

Mayor Hutchinson reported:

- A Proclamation for Prostate Cancer Awareness Month was prepared and mailed to the requestor.
- Stowell Park. Final grading is completed, the light poles are down, additional landscaping was done, the fence for the pickleball courts is painted and should be up by the end of this week.
- Concerts in the Park. OYS Director Kenn Spencer arranged this event. A huge thank-you to our Community Partners because the concerts wouldn't be possible without their donations. Concerts will be on Thursdays this year. The first concert is June 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. and there will be two concerts in September.

Mr. Bradley moved to adopt Ordinance No. 21-20, second by Mr. Earhart. Hearing no discussion, five members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Ordinance No. 21-20 was adopted.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 21-06 KNOWN AS THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE FOR 2021 BY MAKING ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATIONS IN THE GENERAL FUND, THE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND, THE 10% CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, THE ENTERPRISE FUND AND THE TRUST AND AGENCY FUND.

Mr. Sunderland moved to suspend the reading of Ordinance No. 21-21 on three separate days, second by Mr. Bradley. Five members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and the motion passed. Mr. Earhart read Ordinance No. 21-21 for the first time, by title only.

Mr. Earhart moved to adopt Ordinance No. 21-21, second by Mrs. Webb. Hearing no discussion, four members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, one Abstain by Mr. Rehfeldt and Ordinance No. 21-21 was adopted.

At 7:18 p.m., there being no further business to come before the meeting, the same was adjourned upon a motion by Mr. Sunderland, second by Mr. Earhart, and the motion passed.
