

## Special

December 19, 2022

Ontario City Council met in special session on December 19, 2022, in the Municipal Building with Council President Eddie Gallo presiding. The meeting opened at 6:03 p.m., with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present during roll call were Council members Troy Sapp, Dave Rehfeldt, Kyle Webb, Josh Bradley, Rose Feagin, Nathan Sunderland, Council President Eddie Gallo, Mayor Randy Hutchinson, and Service-Safety Director Kris Knapp.

The purpose of the special meeting was to enact legislation. When Mr. Gallo asked for a motion to suspend the rules on all pieces of legislation, Mr. Sunderland made the motion, second by Mr. Sapp. Five members voted Aye, one Nay by Mr. Rehfeldt, and the motion failed. Mr. Rehfeldt was not in favor of passing all legislation and thought only the 2023 temporary appropriations, Ordinance No. 22-57, was to be considered. Following discussion, Mayor Hutchinson requested approval of Ordinance 22-24 and Resolution 22-16.

At 6:08 p.m., Mayor Hutchinson requested postponing the meeting until he could verify if Ordinances 22-24, 22-51 and 22-52 were at the third reading. At 6:12 p.m., the meeting reconvened and Mayor Hutchinson confirmed the three pieces of legislation were at the third reading. President Gallo said he would ask for a vote on Ordinance 22-24, Ordinance 22-57, Resolution 22-16, and table Ordinance 22-51 and Ordinance 22-52 until the January 4<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## **CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTION**

### **ORDINANCE NO. 22-24**

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH DYNEGY ENERGY SERVICES (EAST), LLC D/B/A DYNEGY ENERGY SERVICES, LLC FOR THE ELECTRIC AGGREGATION PROGRAM, AT A RATE NOT TO EXCEED \$0.0814 kwh, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Sapp read Ordinance No. 22-24 for the third time, by title only.

Mr. Sapp moved to adopt Ordinance No. 22-24, second by Mr. Sunderland. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Ordinance No. 22-24 was adopted.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 22-51**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1343, LICENSING OF CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS, REPEALING ORDINANCES 06-13 AND 21-15, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Sunderland moved to table Ordinance 22-51, second by Mr. Webb. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Ordinance No. 22-51 was tabled.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 22 – 52**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1349, UNFIT OR ABANDONED DWELLINGS, UNITS, BUILDINGS, AND STRUCTURES; REPEALING ORDINANCES 87-69, 06-14, AND 07-23; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Sunderland moved to table Ordinance 22-52, second by Mr. Webb. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Ordinance 22-52 was tabled.

## RESOLUTION NO. 22-16

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR TO EXECUTE AGREEMENTS FOR MISCELLANEOUS ENGINEERING, SURVEYING AND DRAFTING SERVICES FOR THE YEARS 2023 THROUGH 2027, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Rehfeldt moved to adopt Resolution No. 22-16, second by Mr. Sapp. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Resolution No. 22-16 was adopted.

## ORDINANCE NO. 22-55

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE EDITION AND INCLUSION OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES AS PARTS OF THE VARIOUS COMPONENT CODES OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF ONTARIO, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Webb read Ordinance No. 22-55 for the second time, by title only.

## ORDINANCE NO. 22-56

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT FOR NON-COLLECTIVE BARGAINING UNIT CITY EMPLOYEES, REPEALING ORDINANCE 22-49, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Sunderland read Ordinance No. 22-56 for the second time, by title only.

## ORDINANCE NO. 22-57

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 22-17 KNOWN AS THE PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE FOR 2022.

Mr. Sunderland moved to suspend the reading of Ordinance No. 22-57 on three separate days, second by Mr. Rehfeldt. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and the motion passed. Ms. Feagin read Ordinance No. 22-57 for the second time, by title only.

Ms. Feagin moved to adopt Ordinance No. 22-57, second by Mr. Sapp. Six members cast their votes Aye, zero Nay, and Ordinance No. 22-57 was adopted.

At 6:27 p.m., there being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned, upon a motion by Ms. Feagin and a second by Mr. Sunderland.
