## **PUBLIC COMMENTARY**

The property isn't maintained, there are weeds 3'- 4' high and work trucks are parked on the street that includes a 1-ton truck, work van, and previously a 5-ton truck. There is room in the driveway to park the trucks instead of the street. Another neighbor called the Health Department three times about the above-ground pool that has had stagnant water for years. It was checked for mosquitoes. There are three disabled vehicles in the driveway, a Ford 150 that has been parked for three years, and two Subarus that haven't moved for two years. There are three working vehicles plus one to two work vans. Section 351.12 Prohibition Against Parking On Streets Or Highways, could possibly apply to this situation. Mr. Tobias sent pictures to Ms. Feagin and thanked her for speaking with him.
