Andy Medwid Prepare conflict of interest policies for board members

Create conflict of interest policies for all board members to sign at the next meeting as part of the 501c3 application process.

Kris Knapp Obtain insurance quote for CIC board

Work with Adam and Ohio Plan to get a quote for Director and Officer Insurance for the CIC board to present at the next meeting.

### Overview

- Ontario CIC board adopted bylaws and elected officers: Kris Knapp as chair,
  Amy Hiner as vice chair, Beth Delaney as secretary, and Paul Boggs as treasurer
- Board scheduled strategic planning session for August 12th from 11 AM to 3
  PM at The Cove to establish priorities and action items
- Andy Medwid will complete 501(c)(3) application now that officers are in place and will have prepared conflict of interest policies for next meeting
- City will obtain director and officer insurance quote through Ohio Plan for the CIC since it requires separate coverage from city insurance
- Board established 3 staggered term groups: Amy and Beth expire December
  31st, 2026, Jay and Nick expire 2027, Jennifer and Paul expire 2028
- Two immediate property opportunities identified: corner house demolition scheduled for second week of October and land auction sign spotted across from former Jilly Junction

### **Board member introductions**

- Jessica Gribben serves as Economic and Community Development Director for the Chamber, helping organize the group with experience from Shelby CIC
- Josh Bradley chairs Economic Development on Ontario City Council and supports CIC as recommendation from comprehensive plan
- Jay Goyal runs Oil Industries manufacturing company in Mansfield, former state representative, and may step down if **50-50** odds acquisition comes through
- Rick Pauley is **3-0year** Ontario resident with workforce background representing the City on the board as a member of the planning commission.
- Andy Medwid serves as Ontario's Law Director in legal capacity, not as board member
- Kris Knapp is Mayor of Ontario with Adam as Service Safety Director joining remotely
- Casey represents Ontario Police Department as sergeant
- Beth Delaney owns business in Ontario for 30 years and lives in Springfield Township
- Jennifer owns Coffee Shop and Pizza Company, open **6 years**, with children who attended Ontario schools for **29 years**
- Amy Hiner serves on board of education and teaches at OSU Mansfield

### Sunshine law requirements

- Andy Medwid explained CIC meetings are private when handling internal governance like bylaws and officer elections
- When acting as city agent for property transactions, meetings become subject to sunshine laws and must be public
- Board decided to follow Shelby CIC model of posting meeting dates on calendar and keeping them open to public
- Board agreed on in-person meetings only, no Zoom access for general public
- Minutes will be kept and made available upon request but not automatically posted online

## Bylaws adoption

- Amy Hiner motioned to adopt bylaws with Beth Delaney seconding the motion
- Board unanimously approved bylaws adoption
- Jessica Gribben noted bylaws can be changed later by board action if needed
- Bylaws establish officers as president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer with **1-year** terms

#### Officer elections

- Kris Knapp elected as chair to serve through January when his mayoral term ends
- · Amy Hiner elected as vice chair
- Beth Delaney elected as secretary with Jessica continuing to assist with meeting minutes
- Paul Boggs elected as treasurer in absentia, with Beth confirming his acceptance
- Board unanimously approved all officer positions
- Andy Medwid noted officers don't need to be board members and can continue serving even if moving from public to private sector

# 501(c)(3) application process

- Andy Medwid will complete application now that officers are elected and corporation is established
- Application requires officer names and addresses on 1023 form
- Andy will prepare conflict of interest policies for all officers to sign at next meeting
- Jessica's 12-month contract with city expires December 2025 unless council renews

# Director and officer insurance

- Jay Goyal raised need for director and officer insurance coverage
- Adam Gongwer confirmed CIC needs separate policy since not covered under city insurance

- Kris Knapp and Adam will work with Ohio Plan to obtain quote for next meeting
- City council will likely approve insurance costs as part of CIC startup funding

### Strategic planning session scheduling

- Board scheduled session for Tuesday, August 12th from 11 AM to 3 PM
- Location confirmed at The Cove after Jennifer offered space with big screen and Wi-Fi
- Ellen Hines and Tom Vanderhorst will likely facilitate to provide CIC background
- Session will cover CIC capabilities, other community examples, comprehensive plan review, and priority setting

# Mission statement proposals

- Beth Delaney presented **3** mission statement options focusing on local growth, community investment, and neighborhood revitalization
- Amy Hiner proposed mission emphasizing vibrant, connected community with bike paths, town center, and community initiatives
- All proposed statements will be included in minutes for board review
- Final mission statement adoption planned for strategic planning session

# **Board term assignments**

- Board divided into 3 staggered groups to prevent all members leaving simultaneously
- Group 1 (Amy Hiner, Beth Delaney): terms expire December 31st, 2026
- Group 2 (vacant, Nick Turnbaugh): terms expire 2027
- Group 3 (Jennifer Meisse, Paul Boggs): terms expire 2028
- Members can serve 3 consecutive 3-year terms before taking mandatory 1year break
- Public sector representatives (city officials) don't have term limits

### Website content planning

 Adam Gongwer recommended transparency including board member names, mission statement, and officer positions

- Board reviewed Adam's list of potential website content based on other Ohio CIC sites
- Minimum recommended content: mission statement, board members, and officers
- Additional content could include CIC-owned properties and development projects when appropriate

# Property development opportunities

- Corner house demolition scheduled for second week of August with Land Bank involvement
- City working with Land Bank and owner on restoration funding
- Property may come to CIC as acquisition opportunity after demolition per comprehensive plan
- Land auction sign spotted across from former Jilly Junction location for vacant lot
- Board noted potential environmental concerns due to former gas station on auction property
- Josh Bradley confirmed auction location matches concept picture from comprehensive plan
