### Report CIC activities to city council

As Economic Development Chair, provide a report to city council on CIC strategic planning outcomes and current activities

#### Overview

- Kris Knapp stepped down as chair to transition leadership to private sector, with Amy Hiner nominated as new chair and Nick Turnbaugh as vice chair, effective immediately
- Board amended bylaws requiring chair and vice chair positions be held by private citizens rather than government officials
- Strategic planning session identified 3 key priorities: quick wins (signage/beautification), Old Ontario redevelopment, and long-term growth opportunities
- Bank account setup progressing with Park National Bank, and insurance policy to be secured for \$1,117 annually through August 15, 2026
- Board vacancy from Jay's departure will be addressed through new application process, with Scott Heiman identified as potential candidate

### Strategic planning recap

- Strategic planning session held **1 week** prior to meeting with lunch provided at the Cove location
- Board identified 3 main themes from the session:
  - Quick wins focusing on signage and beautification (Amy, Jennifer, and Rick agreed to champion this working group)
  - Old Ontario redevelopment as heavy lift requiring full board involvement for property acquisition and strategic site redevelopment
  - Long-term opportunities for additional group initiatives

- Overarching priorities include short and long-term funding strategies, community engagement, and ensuring group sustainability
- Economic Development Chair will report CIC updates to city council going forward

### Officer position changes

- Kris Knapp stepped down as chair effective at end of meeting, citing importance of private sector leadership for community-oriented appearance
- Amy Hiner nominated and approved as new chair (she was previously vice chair)
- Nick Turnba nominated and approved as new vice chair
- Paul remains as treasurer
- Mayor will serve as ex-officio member in officer meetings to provide ongoing knowledge and feedback

### Bylaws amendment for private sector leadership

- Board voted to amend bylaws requiring chair and vice chair positions be held by private citizens rather than government officials
- Amendment passed to prevent CIC from appearing as city branch and maintain community-oriented leadership structure
- · Change takes effect immediately following the meeting

## Board vacancy and application process

- Jay's departure created open seat on private sector side of the board
- Scott Heiman identified as interested candidate Ontario resident with 2 children, works in bank trust department, serves on multiple boards including transit, Renaissance, and Buckeye imagination boards
- Board decided to table appointment decision and develop formal application process
- Jessica will provide application template for board review by September
   15th meeting
- Application will explain time commitments and gather candidate background information

# Bank account and insurance setup

- Bank account setup in progress with Park National Bank pending final documentation and officer changes
- Paul (treasurer) will be contacted for signature requirements once account is ready
- Insurance policy secured through Reinhardt Insurance for \$1,117 annually (coverage period August 15, 2025 to August 15, 2026)
- Coverage includes \$5,000 bonding, \$500,000 general liability, \$100,000 electronic data liability, and \$2 million per person/per occurrence coverage
- Kris will email insurance details to all board members for review

### **Executive session for property purchase**

- Board moved into executive session under ORC 121.22 G2 to consider property purchase for public purposes
- Craig Hunt (36-80 Park Avenue West resident, 68-year Ontario resident with 15
  years of council meeting attendance) offered his knowledge of local history and
  city operations before executive session
